1. INTRODUCTION

Thank you for buying AYAT, the ultimate companion for Muslims worldwide. We hope that you will enjoy using AYAT everyday and that you will provide us with your feedback. This will allow us to continuously enhance our products to meet your needs.

1.1 WHAT IS AYAT?

AYAT is a specially programmed audio player that allows you to listen to, recite and memorize the Holy Quran during “Fard” prayer, “Taraweeh” prayer, and of course outside prayer time as well.

In “Fard” prayer, AYAT will guide you through the prayer process and will read different verses of the Holy Quran at each prayer. You can select any Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz') that you want to memorize. With AYAT, you can memorize an average of ten verses per week and a full Quarter (Rub') in a month.

In “Taraweeh” prayer, AYAT allows you to select a particular Part (Juz'). It will guide you through the prayer process and will read a full Quarter (Rub') at each Prostration (Rakaa) so that you finish the full Part (Juz') in eight Prostrations (four times Two Rakaa Taraweeh).

Outside prayer time, AYAT allows you to listen to the Holy Quran by selecting a particular Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz').

AYAT is fully integrated in the headphones without external wires, so you can wear it conveniently while you pray.

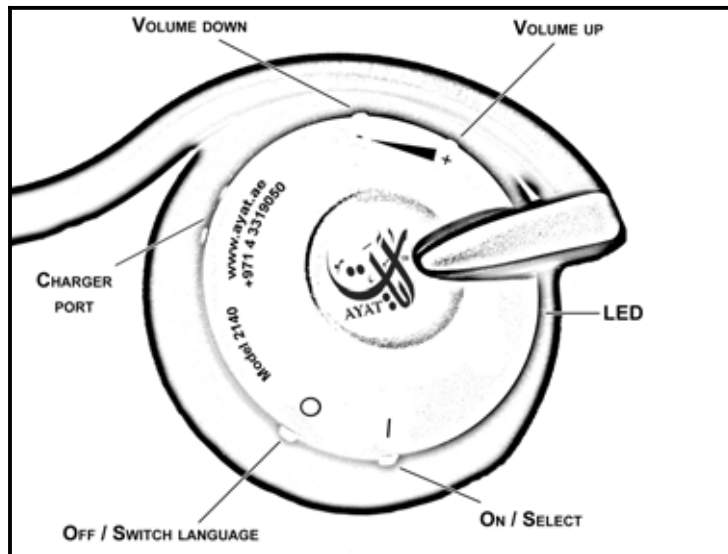
1.2 WHAT'S IN THE BOX?

The AYAT box contains the following:



- AYAT Headphone-style Audio Player
- Two additional speaker foam covers
- Battery charging adapter
- User manual

1.3 AYAT AT A GLANCE



1. On / Select

To turn on AYAT, hold down for 3 seconds and release. The green LED will come on. Click the button again, when you release the green LED will begin blinking and the welcome message will start playing. You will also use this button during the audio prompts, to make your selections.

2. Off / Switch language

To turn off AYAT, hold down for 2 seconds. Also, click this button to switch the audio prompt language (English / Arabic) when AYAT is playing the welcome message.

3. LED

Blinking green = Play, Constant green = Pause, Constant red = Low battery

4. Volume up

Click to increase volume

5. Volume down

Click to decrease volume

6. Charger port

Use to recharge the battery.

2. USING AYAT

2.1 CHARGING THE BATTERY

Please charge the AYAT battery for at least 3 hours before you start using it.

Insert the small-end of the charger into the charging port of AYAT.

Plug the adapter into the wall socket. The red LED light on the adapter will turn on.

Let AYAT charge until the green LED light on the adapter turns on.

2.2 WEARING AYAT

After AYAT has been charged and you are ready to use it, wear it just like you would wear conventional headphones of the type that rests on the neck.



Make sure the neck rest is positioned comfortably on your neck, the speakers cover your ears and you can easily locate the buttons with your fingers.

2.3 STARTING AYAT

To turn AYAT on, press and hold the “|” button for 3 seconds. The green LED will turn on. Click the “|” button again when you release it the green LED will begin blinking. Wear AYAT and you will hear the welcome message. While you hear the welcome message, you can click the “O” button to switch back and forth between Arabic and English. You can click the “|” button at any time during the welcome message to skip to the Main Menu.

AYAT uses audio prompts to help you select the desired option such as prayer, or listening to Quran verses. AYAT's audio prompts are of two types: Multiple Option Menus and Simple Prompts.

2.3.1 Multiple Option Menus

These menus will always require a selection. A Multiple Option Menu example is the Main Menu. The Main Menu lists 6 different options to choose from (1- Two Prostrations (Rakaa), 2- Two Prostrations (Rakaa) Taraweeh, 3- Three Prostrations (Rakaa), 4- Four Prostrations (Rakaa), 5- Listening to Quran, and 6- Setup of preferences). The Main Menu asks you to click the "j" button when you hear the desired option.

2.3.2 Simple Prompts

These prompts will tell you what the current setting of a particular option is and will ask you to click the "j" button only if you want to change that setting. If you don't click the "j" button, then the setting will remain the same. A Simple Prompt example is encountered when you select listening to Quran from the Main Menu, This prompt will acknowledge your selection and will inform you that AYAT will resume playing the Quran from the last verse played unless you click the "j" button to select a different Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz').

3. AYAT SETUP

3.1 LANGUAGE SELECTION

When you turn on AYAT and wear it, you will hear the welcome message. During this message, you can click the “O” button to switch back and forth between Arabic and English. You can also click the “I” button to skip to the Main Menu.

3.2 PRAYER SETUP OPTIONS

Click the “I” button when you hear the sixth option of the Main Menu (setup option). You will hear a series of setup prompts that allow you to customize AYAT for prayer. The setup prompts are as follows:

3.2.1 Quran Sections in Prayer

This prompt tells you the current setting for the Chapters (Surats) that are read during prayer. The options are:

1. The whole Quran.
2. Part (Juz') 30 only. Part (Juz') 30 contains shorter Chapters (Surats) and is more convenient for children.

The prompt will ask you to click the “I” button only if you want to switch from the current setting to the other.

3.2.2 Quran Section Reset

This prompt asks you to click the “|” button only if you want to reset to the beginning of the Quran or the beginning of Part (Juz’) 30 during prayer, depending on your selection in the previous prompt (Quran or Part (Juz’) 30 Selection Prompt). Click only if you want to reset to the beginning.

3.2.3 Reading The Opening (Al Fateha)

This prompt tells you the current setting for reading The Opening (Al Fateha):

1. You read The Opening (Al Fateha) during a silent period
2. Listen to The Opening (Al Fateha) while you read it.

The prompt will ask you to click the “|” button only if you want to switch from the current setting to the other.

3.2.4 Reading The Closing (Al Tashahud)

This prompt tells you the current setting for reading The Closing (Al Tashahud):

1. You read The Closing (Al Tashahud) during a silent period.
2. Listen to The Closing (Al Tashahud) while you read it.

The prompt will ask you to click the “|” button only if you want

to switch from the current setting to the other.

3.2.5 Dua' Feature

If you select to have both The Opening (Al Fateha) and The Closing (Al Tashahud) be read with you during prayer then the Dua' feature of AYAT will be automatically enabled. This feature adds 5 different Dua's throughout the prayer process.

The Dua's occur before the beginning of prayer, after each prostration, between the first and second kneeling of each prostration, after the last Tashahud and after the completion of prayer.

4. MAIN MENU

Once you finish the setup process, AYAT will take you to the Main Menu where you can start using the device for prayer or Quran listening. Following is a detailed description of the different options of the Main Menu.

4.1.1 Two Prostrations

Select this option to pray Morning (Fajr) prayer or Two Prostrations (Rakaa) sunna. AYAT will ask you if you want to repeat the last verses. If you select “repeat”, it will repeat the verses read in the last prayer. Otherwise it will continue from where it left off at the last prayer.

4.1.2 Two Prostrations (Rakaa) Taraweeh

Select this option to pray Two Prostrations (Rakaa) in which a full Quarter (Rub’) is read at each Prostration (Rakaa). This option can be used for example to perform Taraweeh prayer during the month of Ramadan. The Two Prostrations (Rakaa) Taraweeh option allows you to select a particular Part (Juz’), so you can pray four times Two Prostrations (Rakaa) Taraweeh to finish that Part (Juz’). Remember that each Part (Juz’) of the Holy Quran contains eight Quarters (Rub’).

4.1.3 Three Prostrations (Rakaa)

Select this option to pray Sunset (Maghreb) prayer.

4.1.4 Four Prostrations (Rakaa)

Select this option to pray Noon (Zuhr), Afternoon (Asr) and Night (Esha) prayers.

4.1.5 Listen to Quran

Select this option when you want to listen to a specific Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz') of the Holy Quran, anytime, anywhere.

4.1.6 Setup

Select this option at any time to perform the customization described in the above section 3.2.

5. PERFORMING PRAYER

The Main Menu of AYAT offers the options of praying Two Prostrations (Rakaa), Two Prostrations (Rakaa) Taraweeh, Three Prostrations (Rakaa) and Four Prostrations (Rakaa) as described in section 4.

Once your selection is made, you will hear an acknowledgement message followed by a prompt informing you that it will resume verse reading from last verses read in the previous prayer. The prompt will then ask you to click the “|” button if you want to repeat the verses played in the previous prayer. The repeat option allows you to hear the same verses many times during prayer until you memorize them.

Once you have made your selection, AYAT will start the prayer process. Following is a step-by-step example of the process for a Two Prostrations (Rakaa) prayer with AYAT performing the main elements.

5.1 TWO PROSTRATIONS (RAKAA) PROCESS

1. You will hear “Allah Akbar”. Repeat the words and start the prayer.
2. You will hear either the word “Al Fateha” so that you read it alone during a silence period of 15 seconds, or you will hear the actual verses of Al Fateha so that you can you read them in parallel. This depends on your selection in the setup menu.
3. You will hear Quran verses. Read these verses as you

hear them. If you hear these verses many times by selecting the repeat option at each prayer, you will end up memorizing them. Once you memorize them, you can opt not to repeat in order to move on to the following verses.

4. You will hear Allah Akbar. Repeat the words and perform a bow (ruku') and say Subhaana rabbiy al-'azheem three times.
5. You will hear "Sami'a-Ilaahu liman hamidah, Rabbanaa wa lakal-hamd". Repeat these words and stand straight.
6. You will hear " Allah Akbar". Repeat the words and kneel down (first sujud) and say "Subhaana rabbiy al-alaa" three times.
7. You will hear "Allah Akbar". Repeat the words and Sit up.
8. You will hear " Allah Akbar". Repeat the words and kneel down (second sujud) and say "Subhaana rabbiy al-alaa" three times.
9. You will hear "Allah Akbar" with a different tone to indicate that you should stand up. Repeat the words and stand up.
10. Perform the second Prostration (Rakaa) in the same steps described above.
11. After the second sujud of the second Prostration (Rakaa) you will hear either the word "Al Tahiyyat" so that you read The Closing (Al Tashahud) alone, or you will hear the full Closing (Al Tashahud) so that you recite it in parallel.
12. At the end of The Closing, finish the prayer by saying

“Al salamo allaykom wa rahmatullah” twice.

6. SELECTING A CHAPTER OR PART IN PRAYER

When using AYAT for prayer, you can choose to hear verses from either the entire Quran or from Part (Juz') 30 only. This is done through the Setup option of the Main Menu.

If you choose to hear verses from the entire Quran, you can also select which Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz') to start with. AYAT will recite verses starting from the selected Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz') during prayer. When the selected Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz') is finished, AYAT will continue on to the next Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz') from the entire Quran.

If you choose to hear verses from Part (Juz') 30 only, you can also select which Chapter (Surat) to start with. AYAT will recite verses starting from the selected Chapter (Surat) during prayer. When the selected Chapter (Surat) is finished, AYAT will continue on to the next Chapter (Surat) from Part (Juz') 30.

To select a particular Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz') in prayer, go to the "Listen to Quran" option of the Main Menu, select a Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz') (as explained in Section 7), and click the "I" button when you hear the acknowledgement message. This click indicates that you want to hear this Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz') in prayer. After you click, you will hear a short beep acknowledging your request and you will be taken to the Main Menu.

7. LISTENING TO THE QURAN

AYAT allows you to listen to the Holy Quran using three different options:

3. Resume: to continue listening from the last verse played the last time you used AYAT to listen to the Holy Quran.
4. Chapter (Surat) selection: allows you to select a specific Chapter (Surat).
5. Part (Juz') selection: allows you to select a specific (Juz').

7.1 RESUME OPTION

Turn on AYAT. Click when you hear the welcome message to skip to the Main menu.

Select the "Listen to Quran" option in the Main Menu.

Your selection will be acknowledged and you will be informed that AYAT will resume playing the Quran from the last verse played, unless you click the "I" button to indicate that you want to listen to a specific Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz'). If you want to resume from the last verse played, don't click the "I" button. AYAT will resume from the last verse played.

7.2 SELECTING A CHAPTER (SURAT)

Turn on AYAT. Click when you hear the welcome message to skip to the Main menu.

Select the “Listen to Quran” option in the Main Menu.

Your selection will be acknowledged and you will be informed that AYAT will begin playing the Quran from the last verse played, unless you click the “|” button to indicate you want to listen to a specific Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz’).

Click the “|” button to indicate that you want to select a Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz’).

A prompt will tell you that you can select a Chapter (Surat) number unless you click the “|” button to indicate that you want to select a Part (Juz’) number. Since you want to select a Chapter (Surat) number, don’t click the “|” button.

The Chapter (Surat) selection process will now begin. You will hear a succession of prompts that help you select the Chapter (Surat) number you desire.

First Step

Select from the following groups of Chapters (Surats):

1-20, 21-40, 41-60, 61-80, 81-100, 101-114.

Click the “|” button when you hear the group that contains the Chapter (Surat) number you desire. For example, if you want Chapter (Surat) 14, click when you hear “1-20”

Second Step

For the purpose of this tutorial we will assume you want Chapter (Surat) 14, so you selected the group 1-20. You will then be prompted to select from the following subgroups:

1-5, 6-10, 11-15, 16-20.

Since you want Chapter (Surat) 14, click when you hear the subgroup 11-15.

Last Step

You will be prompted to select from the following Chapter (Surat) numbers:

11, 12, 13, 14, 15

Since you want Chapter (Surat) 14, click when you hear 14.

You will hear a confirmation message stating the Chapter (Surat) number and name and AYAT will start playing Chapter (Surat) 14.

7.3 SELECTING A PART (JUZ')

Turn on AYAT, click when you hear the welcome message to skip to the Main menu. Select the "Listen to Quran" option in the Main Menu.

Your selection will be acknowledged and you will be informed that AYAT will begin playing the Quran from the last verse played, unless you click the "J" button to indicate you want to listen to a specific Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz').

Click the “|” button to indicate that you want to select a Chapter (Surat) or Part (Juz’).

A prompt will tell you that you can select by Chapter (Surat) number unless you click the “|” button to indicate that you want to select a Part (Juz’) number. Since you want to select by Part (Juz’), click the “|” button.

The Part (Juz’) selection process will now begin. You will hear a succession of prompts that help you select the Part (Juz’) you desire.

First Step

Select from the following groups of Parts (Juz’):

1-5, 6-10, 11-15, 16-20, 21-25, 26-30.

Click the “|” button when you hear the group that contains the Part (Juz’) you desire. For example, if you want Part (Juz’) 24, click when you hear “21-25”

Last Step

For the purpose of this tutorial we will assume that you want Part (Juz’) 24, so you selected the group 21-25. You will then be prompted to select from the following Part (Juz’):

21, 22, 23, 24, 25.

Since you want Part (Juz’) 24, click when you hear 24.

You will hear a confirmation message stating the Part (Juz’) number and AYAT will start playing Part (Juz’) 24.
